Recyclables

Miscellaneous Papers

Empty Paper Boxes, Receipts, Photos, Carbon Papers, Waterproof Papers, Aluminum Coated Papers, Postcards, Envelopes

※Please tie papers up using paper or plastic strings, or put them into either a paper bag or transparent/semi-transparent plastic bag then seal the opening before disposing.
※Please put cardboard, paper packs, newspapers, flyers, and magazines to private collection boxes and PTA.

Aluminum Cans

•After emptying the contents, rinse with water.
•Do not remove the tab (lid).
•Remove bottle can caps.

Juice cans, Beer cans, Alcohol cans, Beverage bottle cans

Steel cans

•After emptying the contents, rinse with water.
•Do not remove the tab (lid).
•Remove bottle can caps.

Juice cans, Confectionery cans, Tea cans, Food cans

Aesol spray cans and Gas canisters

Hair sprays, Insecticide sprays, Gas canisters

※After using up the contents, release the gas inside via the cap attached to the can and pierce a hole in the can using a dedicated tool, in a well ventilated location clear of fire.

Glass Bottles

• After emptying the contents, rinse with water.

White or Transparent

Juice bottles, Jam jars, Seasoning jars, Cosmetics bottles

Brown

Beer bottles, 1,800 ml sake bottles, Vitamin drink bottles

Other colors

Juice bottles, Liquor bottles, Cosmetics bottles

※Sort glass bottles by color, and put all other colors besides white, clear, or brown into "Others [その他]".
※If it does not come clean even after washing, the contents have hardened, or it is broken, put it in "Kinds of Rubbles [かたぎ類]".
※It is not necessary to remove plastic that is stuck to the opening or to remove labels that are stuck on tight.

Metal Items and Small Electric Appliances

• Metal products
• Small electric appliances, except TV sets, air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, clothes dryers, and personal computers. (Make sure to remove dry-cell batteries.)
• Items with a piece of metal
• Metallic lids
• Take items that do not fit in the container (74cmX49cmX35cm) on your own to a disposing facility.

Stoves, Fan heater, Large cans (18 L), Fans, Vacuums, Printers, Video / DVD sets, Bicycles, Electric bicycles, Tricycles

※Please remove the batteries and empty the kerosene out of the tank/body of the heater.
※Make sure to drain oil.
※Cut into lengths of 1 m or less.

Microwaves, Video game sets, Electrical cords, Frying pans, Umbrellas, Kettles, Cooking pots, Gas cooking stoves, IH cooking heaters, Metallic lids

※When disposing of bicycles, first cancel the anti-theft registration, then attach a paper with "不用(waste) or [処分] (dispose)" written on it.
※Remove batteries from electric bicycles. Ask a sales outlet for the removal and disposal.

Plastic Containers and Packaging

Items marked with [Pla]

※Please use up the contents of the containers and rinse them lightly before disposing.

Plastic bags, Styrofoam, Bubble cushioning material (bubble wrap), Bags for snacks, Tubes, Cups for noodles, Labels of PET bottles, Food trays and various containers

Cooking oil bottles, Face-wash bottles, Liquid detergent bottles

Plastic Pet Bottles

Items marked with [1PET]

※Put plastic tops and labels into "Plastic Containers and Packaging [プラスチック製容器包装]".
※Please use up the contents of the containers and rinse them lightly before disposing.
※You do not need to remove a ring around the mouth of a PET bottle.

Used Cooking Oil

• Only vegetable oils

Items accepted:
Vegetable oils thrown out from households (edible oil used in deep frying)
Oils that use vegetable ingredients such as soybean oil, rapeseed oil, safflower oil, corn oil, olive oil, and salad oil.

※After cooling to room temperature, pour it via a strainer into a PET bottle or an empty plastic bottle for cooking oil that is either transparent or translucent, then close the lid.
※Empty bottles for edible oil usually have caps that easily come off, so it is recommended to use a PET bottle. If using empty bottles for edible oil, wrap the cap part and fix it with a rubber band.

Batteries

Cylindrical dry-cell batteries, Manganese batteries, alkaline batteries, etc.
Button batteries, Rechargeable batteries (Nickel-cadmium batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries, and lithium-ion batteries)

※To prevent shorts, put plastic tape on both the positive and negative terminals of rechargeable batteries.
From a recycling perspective, it is recommended to bring rechargeable batteries to the collecting boxes located in electronics retail stores.

Fluorescent Tubes

Fluorescent Tubes, Compact fluorescent light bulbs, Clinical thermometers (containing mercury), Thermometers (containing mercury)

※Put cracked bulbs, incandescent lamps, light bulbs, and LED lamps in "Kinds of Rubbles [かたぎ類]".
