#### **Batteries**

Cylindrical dry-cell batteries, Manganese batteries, alkaline batteries, etc. Button batteries, Rechargeable batteries (Nickel-cadmium batteries, nickel-metal hydride batteries, and lithium-ion batteries)



To prevent shorts, put plastic tape on both the positive and negative terminals of rechargeable batteries.

From a recycling perspective, it is recommended to bring rechargeable batteries to the collecting boxes located in electronics retail stores. (Expanded batteries etc. cannot be collected.


